Item 1. Introduction

BCP Advisors LLC d/b/a BCP Global ("BCP Global") is an investment adviser registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. Brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ; therefore, it is important for you to understand the differences. Free and simple tools are available to research firms and financial professionals at <u>Investor.gov/CRS</u>, which also provides educational materials about broker-dealers, investment advisers, and investing.

Item 2. Relationships and Services

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

Description of Services and Monitoring: We provide investment advisory services to retail investors. We also offer subadvisory portfolio management services to Third-Party Investment Advisers who manage discretionary accounts. Our services are provided primarily through our automated digital platform. For clients to whom we provide asset management services, we offer both fee plus transaction accounts and wrap fee accounts, both of which we monitor as part of an ongoing process. Investment positions are monitored daily and accounts are reviewed by a manager at least quarterly. Additional reviews may be triggered by changes in an account holder's personal, tax, or financial status. We must obtain pertinent information and review your financial situation and investment profile, including your risk tolerance, to determine and set the appropriate short and long-term investment goals and objectives. We encourage you to notify us if there have been any changes in your financial situation or investment objectives, or if you wish to impose any reasonable restrictions or modify any existing reasonable restrictions on the management of your account.

Investment Authority: We offer our asset management and wrap fee accounts on a discretionary basis through virtual interaction over the Internet using a technology platform developed and maintained by the firm. Discretionary asset management allows us the limited authority to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you each time a transaction is placed.

<u>Investment Offerings</u>: While we can advise on any investment asset, we work primarily with exchange traded funds ("ETFs") and/or Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities ("UCITS"). ETFs are investment funds made up of a collection of assets, such as stock and bonds, that are traded like individual stocks. UCITS are mutual funds registered in Europe under a unified regulatory framework that can be sold to investors worldwide. Consequently, they provide excellent diversification and liquidity. The portfolios are designed to automatically adjust according to your personal risk tolerance while remaining globally diversified. We do not impose a minimum account size.

Item 3. Fees, Costs, Conflicts, and Standard of Conduct

What fees will I pay?

Our fees are based on the types of services we provide. For cash accounts, we charge a tiered fee structure that ranges from 1.10% to 1.85% of the Net Liquidation Value ("NLV") of the account on a daily basis. For margin accounts the advisory fee is calculated based on the daily Market Value of the account's margin balance. Margin involves borrowing money from your brokerage firm to buy securities and the margin balance is the amount owed to your brokerage firm. Our fees are paid in arrears for services provided during each calendar month. You grant us authority have the fees automatically calculated and deducted monthly from your account held by the custodian.

Our services also include the selection of other advisers, which offers clients the opportunity to participate in our wrap fee program. Fees associated with the wrap fee program will include most transaction costs and fees to a broker-dealer or bank that has custody of these assets, and therefore are higher than a typical asset-based advisory fee.

<u>Other Fees and Costs</u>: Some investments, such as mutual funds, impose additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time. Those fees may include mutual fund expenses and surrender charges. You may also pay other fees to the custodian of your assets. These include, but may not be limited to, ticket charges on transactions, fees for wire transfers, stop payments, IRA maintenance, duplicate check or statement copies, overnight deliveries, returned checks, and asset transfers.

<u>Additional Information</u>: You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce the amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means.

Two of the three Members of the company are registered representatives of an unaffiliated broker-dealer. Through the brokerdealer they can offer commission-based products for which they receive additional compensation. This additional compensation causes a conflict of interest as they have an incentive to solicit commission-based products. However, the risk is mitigated because neither of the two Members registered with the unaffiliated broker dealer act as Investment Adviser Representatives of BCP Global.

How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

We only generate revenues from our asset management services as described above. In 2018 and 2019, we secured additional funding for BCP by issuing two promissory notes that are convertible to equity interests in the firm on the Maturity Date. The notes were issued to investors who are clients of BCP. This creates a potential conflict of interest because the Firm is incentivized to give preferential treatment and/or spend more time on these client accounts, due to their status as both a lender and ultimate equity owner. We feel the potential conflict of interest is mitigated because client accounts are managed by model portfolios selected by the client. The model portfolios are monitored and rebalanced to the target mix within one or two quarterly review cycles, and the rebalancing affects all clients in the model portfolio.

Our investment advisors are compensated through salaries and/or a portion of revenue we receive for the advisory services we provide. The portion paid to your investment advisors generally does not vary based on the type of investments that are recommended.
